Hair and Hair Decorations

Hair that is below shoulder length should be tied up for PE and all sports clubs, including Sports Day.

No extreme haircuts, including: Mohicans, spikes, shaved decorations or bright colours

Hair decorations should be:

Reasonably sized

Simple, practical and in school colours (red, grey, black, white, silver, gold or natural coloured)

Can include hairbands, bobbles, clips and scrunchies.

No hair extensions.

PE Kit

Children should come to school on their PE day wearing their PE kit.

Parents/carers will be informed of their child's PE day by text, in class newsletters and via Dojo every half term

All children should wear the following items for PE lessons:

Plain red t-shirt

Black or navy plain tracksuit bottoms, leggings or shorts


Trainers

Red, black or navy plain hoody

Children must not wear football kits or brightly coloured tracksuits for $\ensuremath{\mathsf{PE}}$

All earrings and watches (including sports trackers) should be removed for PE and sports activities.

St Hild's College CE Aided Primary School Uniform Policy



Shine Bright

The following policy has been agreed by the Governing Body of St Hild's College CE Aided Primary School to ensure that our uniform policy is understood and correctly followed by all children in school

It is our aim to ensure that all children wear the school uniform correctly and with pride.

We appreciate your co-operation.

Our School Uniform

Children should wear the following:

Black or grey skirt, pinafore or trousers
White Polo shirt
Red cardigan or sweatshirt
White or grey socks or red or grey tights
Summer dresses in red and white gingham
Children should not wear leggings or jeans

Footwear

Black/Grey sensible school shoes
Plain black boots
Plain black trainers with black or dark coloured laces only

Plimsolls in a variety of sizes have been purchased by school. Children attending school in shoes which do not conform to our school uniform will be provided with plimsolls to change into.

It was agreed, for health and safety reasons, that the following footwear is not on the uniform list and should not be worn for school:

Flossies, canvas shoes/boots, UGG boots or similar designs, flip flops and sandals.

No medium or high heeled shoes or boots.

Wellies are great footwear to come to school when the weather is bad.

Wellies will also be needed for Forest School sessions.

Shoes or plimsolls (not slippers) must be brought into school to change into.

Wellies should not be worn all day.

Swimming

Children must wear either a one-piece swim suit or trunks. Bikinis and long surf shorts are not allowed. All children with long hair must wear a swimming cap.

Goggles can be worn if required.

Jewellery

Many schools consider that the wearing of any type of jewellery, including earrings, is a danger to the health and safety of children in school.

At St Hild's, we allow **one** pair of studs to be worn in the earlobes.

Earrings should not be worn on PE days or swimming days. If a child has their ears pierced during term time, they will need to bring plasters from home to cover their earrings in PE lessons during the 6—8 week healing period. We would, however, advise that if children are having their ears pierced, they do this at the beginning of the summer holidays.

School staff are not permitted to cover children's earrings for PE – this must be done by parents/carers before school or by the child.

One pair of small studs to be worn in the bottom of the earlobe only. Hooped earrings must not be worn.



No other facial or body piercings to be worn.

A watch can be worn, appropriately sized.

Make-up and Nails

No make-up should be worn

No nail varnish or false nails

No fake tan or false tattoos should be worn in school

There may be times when exceptions to our uniform policy may be considered. Please make an appointment with the Head Teacher to discuss any adaptations you feel are necessary to support your child in our school.
